The Government of Canada Adaptation Action Plan was released alongside the National Adaptation Strategy in November 2022. It has been updated to include new federal investments and initiatives related to flooding, freshwater, supply chains, and security.

Highlighted are \$164.2 million investment through the National Adaptation Strategy announcement in November 2022, to advance the ongoing Flood Hazard Identification and Mapping Program (FHIMP).
